NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING Susquehanna River Basin Commission

Public Review and Comment; Public Hearing – 2013 Update of Comprehensive Plan

SUMMARY: On June 20, 2013, the Susquehanna River Basin Commission released a proposed 2013 Update of the Comprehensive Plan for the Water Resources of the Susquehanna River Basin Commission (2013 Update of the Comprehensive Plan) for public review and comment. In accordance with Section 14.1 of the Susquehanna River Basin Compact, the Commission shall develop and adopt, and may from time to time review and revise a comprehensive plan for management of the basin's water resources. As part of the public comment process, the Commission will hold a public hearing to hear testimony on the 2013 Update of the Comprehensive Plan. Written comments may be submitted at any time during the public comment period.

DATES: The public hearing will convene on August 15, 2013, at 3:00 p.m. The public hearing will end at 5:00 p.m. or at the conclusion of public testimony, whichever is sooner. The deadline for the submission of written comments is August 26, 2013, at which time the public comment period will close.

ADDRESSES: The public hearing will be conducted at the Pennsylvania State Capitol, Room 8E-B, East Wing, Commonwealth Avenue, Harrisburg, Pa.

Saratoga County Board of Supervisors

On June 18, 2013 the County of Saratoga awarded a contract pursuant to Section 120-w of NYS General Municipal Law approving the sale of the Saratoga County Landfill Facility to Finch Paper LLC of Glens Falls New York. This award was made following: 1) the establishment of lead agency pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act [SEQRA], 2) the review by the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors of the Environmental Assessment Form which did not identify any issues requiring further review, 3) a determination by the Board of Supervisors that the transfer of ownership will not result in any material change in permit conditions or the scope of permitted activities and is therefore a Type II action pursuant to 6 NYCRR 617.5(c)(26), and 4) the approval by the Board of Supervisors of particularized findings with respect to the proposals received in response to the final request for proposals. The resolutions of the Board of Supervisors with respect to the SEQRA, particularized findings, and the sale of the landfill facility are posted on the County website at www.saratogacountyny.gov. The validity of this contract or the procedures which led to its award may be hereafter contested only by action, suit or proceeding commenced within 60 days after the date of this notice and only upon the ground or grounds that: 1) such award or procedure was not authorized pursuant to that section, or 2) any of the provisions of that section which should be complied with at the date of this publication have not been substantially complied with, or 3) a conflict of interest can be showing the manner in which the contract was awarded; or by action, suit or proceeding commenced on the grounds that such contract was awarded in violation of the Constitution.
