The New York State Department of Health (DOH) is required by the provisions of the federal Beaches Environmental Assessment and Coastal Health (BEACH) Act to provide for public review and comment on the Department's beach monitoring and notification plan. The BEACH Act (Section 406(b) of the Clean Water Act) enacted a federal Environmental Protection Agency grant program available to states, such as New York, with coastal recreational waters. Coastal recreational waters include the Great Lakes and marine coastal waters that are designated for swimming, bathing, surfing, or similar water contact activities. The Act is not applicable to inland waters or waters upstream of the mouth of a river or stream having an unimpaired natural connection with the open sea.

The beach monitoring and public notification plan also includes information on the beach evaluation and classification process, including a list of waters to be monitored and beach ranking. Also included in this plan, is the sampling design and monitoring plan, including sampling location and sampling frequency. Lastly, the plan contains information on procedures for public notification and risk communication, including methods to notify the public of a swimming advisory or beach closure.

The Department of Health proposes to amend the Title XIX (Medicaid) State Plan as follows:

Effective April 1, 2014, the e-prescription financial incentive for medical practitioners will cease and reimbursement at 80 cents per electronic prescription/fiscal order will end.

In addition, the e-prescription financial incentive for dispensing pharmacies will cease and reimbursement at 20 cents per electronic prescription/fiscal order will also end.

Estimated annual aggregate savings in Medicaid expenditures is approximately \$3,060,000 for the first year of implementation, SFY 2014-15. The estimated annual aggregate savings in Medicaid expenditures is approximately \$4,300,000 for SFY 2015-16.

Pursuant to 42 CFR Section 447.205, the Department of Health hereby gives public notice of the following:

The Department of Health proposes to amend the Title XIX (Medicaid) State Plan for non-institutional services related to temporary rate adjustments to providers that are undergoing a closure, merger, consolidation, acquisition or restructuring themselves or other health care providers. These payments are authorized by current State statutory and regulatory provisions. The following provides clarification to provisions previously noticed on December 24, 2013 and January 29, 2014, and notification of new significant changes.

The temporary rate adjustment previously approved for Brooklyn Hospital Center for an aggregate payment amount of up to \$14,000,000 (noticed January 29, 2014), has been modified and the aggregate payment amount has been reduced. The modified aggregate payment amount is now up to \$10,000,000 of which \$5,000,000 each will be contained in the budget for State Fiscal Years 2013/2014 and 2014/2015.

In addition, temporary rate adjustments have been reviewed and approved for 15 Critical Access Hospital providers with aggregate payment amounts totaling \$5,000,000 (noticed December 24, 2013), for the period February 1, 2014 through March 31, 2015. The approved providers along with their individual estimated aggregate amounts include:

He is proposing to construct 4' x 22'+/- set of stairs with platforms, a 4' x 130' low profile open grate catwalk, and 4'x3' steps. The catwalk is proposed to be supported by 10" diameter piles and the floats are proposed to be supported by 12" diameter piles.

The stated purpose is "Proposed Recreational Dock Facility."

The New York State Department of State (DOS) is required by Federal regulations to provide timely public notice for the activities described below, which are subject to the consistency provisions of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, as amended.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Buffalo District (Corps) has determined that the proposed activity will be undertaken in a manner consistent to the maximum extent practicable with the enforceable policies of the New York State Coastal Management Program. The applicant's consistency determination and accompanying supporting information and data are available for inspection at the New York State Department of State offices located at One Commerce Plaza, 99 Washington Avenue in Albany, New York.

The Corps has received funding through the Disaster Relief Appropriations Act (Hurricane Sandy) to conduct maintenance dredging on Lake Erie in fiscal year (FY) 2014. The funds allocated under this program are intended to allow the Corps to remove shoals that have accumulated within the Federal navigation channels and restore them to 'pre-storm conditions' to the extent practical in order to maintain sufficient depth for shallow and/or deep-draft vessels, as appropriate.

In F-2014-0037 (DA) – Barcelona Harbor at Lake Erie (Town of Westfield, Chautauqua County) – Authorized channel depths in Barcelona Harbor are 10 feet below LWD in the Entrance Channel

and 8 feet below LWD in the Inner Harbor Channel. Both areas will be dredged during this operation to an estimated 6 feet below LWD in order to return the channels to pre-storm conditions. Up to an additional one foot of material may be removed to insure the minimum depth is achieved and account for inaccuracies in the dredging process. Approximately 40,000 cubic yards of material will be dredged from the Federal navigation channels during the FY14 operation tentatively scheduled to occur between June 15 and November 1, 2014. Material dredged from the Federal navigation channels are proposed to be placed in the existing, authorized open-lake placement area in Lake Erie, located three miles northwest of the Barcelona Harbor West Breakwater light, at an azimuth of 45°00'.
