## PUBLIC NOTICE Department of Agriculture and Markets

In the Matter of considering whether a natural disaster, act of God, or continued adverse weather conditions has destroyed no less than forty percent of certain grape varieties grown or produced in New York State, for the 2014 crop year, and used for winemaking, pursuant to Agriculture and Markets Law section 16(42) and Alcoholic Beverage Control Law section 76-a(5)(b)

## DETERMINATION

Pursuant to Alcoholic Beverage Control Law section 76-a(5)(b), I am authorized to allow duly licensed farm wineries to manufacture or sell wine from grapes grown outside of New York State if certain conditions have been met. I have received a report titled "Estimates of Wine Grape Reduction due to Winter Injury in New York in 2014", prepared by the Cornell University Cooperative Extension, and, after reviewing such report and assessing the findings set forth therein, I have determined that such conditions have been met; that is, I have determined that:

- Not less than forty percent of the following varieties of grapes grown or produced for winemaking in New York State were destroyed during the 2014 crop year; that is, Brianna, Cabernet Franc, Cabernet Sauvignon, Chardonnay, Frontenac, Gamay Noir, Gewurztraminer, La Crescent, Lemberger, Merlot, Noiret, Pinot Gris, Pinot Noir, Riesling, and Syrah; and
- Such destruction was caused by continued adverse weather conditions during the winter of 2013-2014.

Upon this Determination, I will receive and decide, after consulting with the Chairman of the State Liquor Authority, applications of eligible farm wineries for authorization to manufacture or sell wine produced from out-of-state grapes or juice, with respect to each of the above-referenced grape varieties, pursuant to Alcoholic Beverage Control Law section 76-a(5)(b) and Part 197 of Title One of the Of-

ficial Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York.
