Pursuant to 42 CFR Section 447.205, the Department of Health hereby gives public notice of the following:

The Department of Health proposes to amend the Title XIX (Medicaid) State Plan for non-institutional services to comply with enacted statutory provisions. The following changes are proposed:

Non-Institutional Services

Clarifies the initiative previously noticed March 30, 2016, regarding an increase to access, and improving education/outreach, for the comprehensive coverage and promotion of long acting reversible contraception (LARC) by requiring separate payments be made for the cost of LARC methods to providers and allowing Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) providers to be paid for the cost of LARC in addition to the PPS rate. Increasing use of LARC has significant potential to reduce unintended pregnancies.

The estimated annual net aggregate increase in gross Medicaid expenditures attributable to this initiative contained in the budget for state fiscal year 2016/2017 is \$545 thousand.

Pursuant to 42 CFR Section 447.205, the Department of Health hereby gives public notice of the following:

The Department of Health proposes to amend the Title XIX (Medicaid) State Plan for institutional and non-institutional services to comply with statutory provisions of Chapter 550 of the Laws of 2014. The following changes are proposed:

Effective on or after June 1, 2016, telehealth services are being amended to change the definitions of telehealth modalities; expand telehealth beyond telemedicine to include store and forward technology and remote patient monitoring; expand the provision and reimbursement to practitioners of health care services provided via telehealth; and establish guidelines for the safe and effective delivery of such services.

The impact of these amendments will increase access to health care services by eliminating barriers to care faced by Medicaid recipients in rural communities and in areas where there is a shortage of health care practitioners. In addition, these amendments will make it possible for telehealth providers at distant sites to collect; review; and monitor health information and medical data from Medicaid recipients with chronic impairments and technology dependent care needs.

The estimated annual net aggregate increase in gross Medicaid expenditures attributable to this initiative contained in the budget for state fiscal year 2016/2017 is \$1,250,000.

In F-2016-0348, or "Westchester Creek Horizontal Directional Drilling (HDD) Project", Consolidated Edison (or Con Edison) is proposing to relocate existing 4 kilovolt (4kV) submarine electric cables which are currently located under the Unionport Bridge, at Bruckner Boulevard and within the bed of the Westchester Creek in Bronx, NY. The New York City Department of Transportation (DOT) is replacing the Unionport Bridge and is requiring Con Edison to relocate the distribution cables. The project includes the use of horizontal directional drilling technology to install the electric cable conduits within a 36 inch diameter borehole beneath Westchester Creek. [HDD is a trenchless technology that minimizes disruption and impacts to the river bed soils and benthic habitat.] The proposed location for the new cable crossing is north of the Unionport Bridge, at Chatterton and Brush Avenues. Con Edison has an easement at this location as well as other, existing utilities including 13kV feeders.

The project will be conducted within or adjacent to navigable waters of the United States and New York State jurisdictional wetlands and is planned for two phases of work with the first scheduled to begin in the Fall of 2016. The proposed activities would be undertaken within the Waterfront Revitalization Program (WRP) planning area for the City of New York and activities must be consistent with the policies of this Program as well as with the policies of the NYS CMP. Interest Rates

The Commissioner of Taxation and Finance hereby sets the interest rates for the months of July, August, September, 2016 pursuant to sections 697(j) and 1096(e) of the Tax Law, as follows:

For purposes of section 697(j) the overpayment rate of interest is set at 3 percent per annum, and the underpayment rate of interest is set at 7.5 percent per annum. For purposes of section 1096(e), the overpayment rate of interest is set at 3 percent per annum, and the underpayment rate of interest is set at 8 percent per annum. (The underpayment rates set pursuant to sections 697(j) and 1096(e) may not be less than 7.5 percent per annum.) Pursuant to section 1145(a)(1) of the Tax Law, the underpayment rate for State and local sales and use taxes administered by the Commissioner of Taxation and Finance is 14.5 percent per annum. The underpayment rate for the special assessments on hazardous waste imposed by section 27-0923 of the Environmental Conservation Law is 15 percent.

* The Tax Law requires the interest rate on sales tax assessments or late payments to be set at 14-1/2% for this quarter. However, if the Commissioner determines that the failure to pay or the delay in payment is due to reasonable cause and not willful neglect, the Commissioner may impose interest at the corporation tax late payment and assessment rate. That rate is 8% for this quarter.

** There are a number of state and local governmental bodies that have interest rates tied to the overpayment and underpayment rates contained in either section 697(j) (Income Tax) or section 1096(e) (Corporation Tax) of the Tax Law. For purposes of section 697(j) and section 1096(e) of the Tax Law, the overpayment rate for this period is 3%. For purposes of section 697(j) of the Tax Law, the underpayment rate for this period is 7.5%. For purposes of section 1096(e) of the Tax Law, the underpayment rate for this period is 8%.

*** Under section 527(f) of the Tax Law, the interest rates relating to the Fuel Use tax are set pursuant to the International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA). For more information regarding IFTA interest rates, see www.iftach.org.
