367-92-01 Matter of Edgar Henriques, 16 Cobble Hill Road, Loudonville, New York 12211, for a variance concerning Multiple Residence Law requirements prohibiting wood wainscoting in stairs and entrance halls, and requirements that doors to public halls be equipped with self-closers, interior openings to public stair other than doors be sealed with fire resistive material, cellar ceiling be fire retarded, and a self-closing fire door be provided at cellar stairs.

Involved is an existing three-story, three unit, multiple dwelling residence of masonry construction at 462 Madison Avenue, City of Albany, Albany County, New York.
