

**SUBJECT:** Procedure for submission and approval of project applications; consumptive use regulation; ground-water withdrawal regulation.

**PURPOSE:** The Susquehanna River Basin Commission has amended its project review regulations in order to clarify language, eliminate redundant provisions and eliminate or modify requirements that are outdated or difficult to implement. The State Administrative Procedure Act, Section 102(1) exempts the Commission from the rule making procedures of the SAPA; however, the Commission still wishes to give public notice of its action in the *New York Register*.

**BACKGROUND:** These amendments were first proposed in notices appearing in the *Federal Register* on August 11, 1989 at p. 33036 and the *New York Register* on August 23, 1989 at p. 92. A public hearing was held on the amendments in Painted Post, N.Y. on May 10, 1990. A notice of final rule making reviewing comments received and setting forth the final amendments was published in the *Federal Register* on September 25, 1990 at p. 39142. The amendments became effective as of the date of this publication.
