STATEWIDE — Pursuant to 15 CFR 923.84(b), the New York State Department of State (DOS) hereby gives notice that the federal Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM) concurred on September 7, 1988 with DOS on one routine program implementation action. The action is the incorporation of the City of North Tonawanda Local Waterfront Revitalization Program into New York State's Coastal Management Program (CMP).
